3. H23 Strengthen Child Labor Violation Penalties - Filed 1/29/09. Amending chapter 95 of the general statutes to protect the health and safety of children by increasing the penalties for violations of child labor laws. (Enacted into Law)
4. H218 Parent & Student Educational Involvement Act - Filed 2/18/09. An act to modify the requirements for the notice that must be given to a parent when a student is recommended for a suspension of more than ten days or an expulsion from school. (Enacted into Law)

To extend the deadline for the commissioners in a partition action to report back to the court on their proposed division of the land, and to extend the deadline for responding to a summons in a partition action from ten days to thirty days, as recommended by the partition sales study committee. (Enacted into Law)
10. H619 (incorporated in budget bill – SB 202) NC Green Business Fund – Filed 3/16/09. To change the NC Green Business Fund from a grant-making fund to a no-interest loan-making fund and to appropriate funds to the department of commerce for the NC Green Business Fund. (Enacted into law)
11. H650 Roanoke Rapids/No Loiter For Drugs - Filed 3/17/09. To make it a criminal offense to loiter in the city of Roanoke Rapids for violating the controlled substance Laws. (Enacted into Law)
12. H898 No Killing Of Grass Carp - Filed 3/30/09. To prohibit the possession or taking of grass carp from the Gaston or Roanoke Rapids reservoirs or from the Roanoke River. (Enacted into Law)
